(1) This month the detachment addressed the issue of Substance abuse by being highly visible, approachable, and available to enforce laws in respect to substance abuse. Members of the Hay River detachment are committed to intelligence gathering, which contributes to, not only in Hay River, Enterprise and the KFN Dene Reserve but the entire Northwest Territories Drug and Crime strategy.

(2) This month the detachment addressed the issue of Domestic Violence by continuing to respond and investigate complaints of domestic violence. These investigations are carefully scrutinized to ensure as always, a high level of service.

(3) This month the detachment was involved with youth by continuing to make contact with the youth in the KFN area. Please see S/Cst. BECK's reports for these activities

(4) As always, the Hay River RCMP remain vigilant in attempting to maintain a high level of Community Policing. Please see below reports for these activities

Update on work being performed by ACCP S/Cst. Beck:

The potato program was completed and harvested in the end of October. The potatoes were cleaned and donated to the Local Soup kitchen and yielded over 500 pounds of potatoes. The potatoes were planted by elementary school kids, maintained through the summer by people struggling with addictions and harvested by inmates from the South Mackenzie Correctional Center. This was double the amount of potatoes from last year.

The start of the month once again kicked off with the start of the trapping season. Special CST Steve Beck met with the schools and set some dates for the Take a kid trapping program. Dates were set and a combined reserve and Ecole Boreal school group will attend the camp from mid-February until mid-March.

S/CST Steve BECK and CPL Greg MORROW assisted the Katlodechee First nations Reserve by leading the sober walk that provided rides for local elders and doing a presentation kicking off the start of National Addictions Awareness week. S/CST BECK did several other presentations throughout the entire week for groups from Kindergarten to Adult Ed.

Members were called upon to assist a local elder in processing his own cow in to meat for the winter. The elder is 82 years old and unable to do this anymore. He was out of meat and needed it done. Members along a correctional officer from SMCC attended a local farm and process two cattle for the elder filling his fridge with enough meat to get through the winter.

Members of the Hay River Detachment and their families decorated a Santa parade float and participated in the local parade with a full complement of youth from 4 separate schools. Members of the Hay River detachment provided assistance with circle sentencing and alternative measures clients of the reserve. Members were asked to participate in and be present when possible to help develop a working relationship with the Justice committee and the clients its serves.

Members of the Hay River detachment are in the process of developing a program that will take local form the reserve and have them cut and deliver firewood for the local elders that are unable to get it themselves throughout the communities. The goal is to deliver the wood prior to Christmas. The will put youth and elders back in touch with one another reconnecting the connections between the culturally recognized and important relationships.

Members of the Hay River detachment volunteered at the local Polar cup Biathlon cup which saw 90 youth attend and compete. Members were responsible for range safety and resetting knocked down targets as well as organizing a potluck dinner for all out of town meals. Member have also organized a lottery that is to raise fund to purchased new equipment for the Hay River Ski Club



Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

(1) This month the detachment addressed the issue of Substance abuse by being highly visible, approachable, and available to enforce laws in respect to substance abuse. Members of the Hay River detachment are committed to intelligence gathering, which contributes to, not only in Hay River, Enterprise and the KFN Dene Reserve but the entire Northwest Territories Drug and Crime strategy.

(2) This month the detachment addressed the issue of Domestic Violence by continuing to respond and investigate complaints of domestic violence. These investigations are carefully scrutinized to ensure as always, a high level of service.

(3) This month the detachment was involved with youth by continuing to make contact with the youth in the KFN area. Please see S/Cst. BECK's reports for these activities

(4) As always, the Hay River RCMP remain vigilant in attempting to maintain a high level of Community Policing. Please see below reports for these activities

Update on work being performed by ACCP S/Cst. Beck:

The month of December was a busy one.

-The Hay River Detachment with the help of their families organized and participated in the third annual Toy drive which saw gifts go to over 250 children in the town of Hay River. Over \$3800 dollars was also raised and 100 Turkey dinners were distributed to families in and around Hay River. Over 200 pounds of potatoes, 110 pounds of carrots complete with stuffing and cranberry sauce were donated to the Local soup kitchen to provide meals to the less fortunate. 10 Turkey dinners and gifts were sent to the Fort Resolution detachment and were distributed to families there. This Project saw over 80 voluntary hours from members in the detachment and the same from their families to complete the gathering wrapping and distribution of the gifts and dinners. People were vocally grateful for the effort put forth by the Hay River detachment

-A week long community on the Land Project was organized and done near the NWT/ALTA border with the Hay River Dene Reserve. The project saw youth come together with elders and other members of the Katlodechee First Nations reserve to secure meat for a feast on the reserve. Youth worked alongside elders to complete several carpentry projects as well as piping in furnaces and camp stoves on site. Ladies at the camp taught traditional beading and moccasin making as well as showed youth how to prepare meals in a camp setting. This project brought income to people who have difficulty securing employment due to addiction issues. The camp setting allowed them to work in a sober and positive environment with sober and skilled people that would not necessarily have positive contact with at home. It goes a long way to setting up a support base to beat the addictions once back in the community. Further all involved worked alongside RCMP members strengthening and striking up new partnerships in the communities. 2 caribou were harvested and several loads of firewood were sent back to help families heat homes through the cold winter months.

-Members also helped organise and set up a try out for the Arctic Winter games biathlon club. Meals were organised by member's families and due to weather the tryout had to be moved inside. Members helped with set up and takedown of an indoor makeshift range and were present to cheer the athletes on as they participated in this very positive event. Over 50 athletes from across the north attended.

These were all very large undertakings and along with the regular hours put forth by the ACC program over 200 VOT hours were put in December.

Notable Occurrences for the Month:

-2013-12-04: Hay River RCMP executed a Search Warrant on a residence in Hay River under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. During the search, approximately one half pound of marijuana and cash were seized. Two females are currently facing drug trafficking related charges under the Controlled Substances Act. (File #2013-1545851)

-2013-12-06: Hay River RCMP arrested two persons as a result a traffic stop in the community. During the investigation, a significant amount of marijuana/crack cocaine was located. Two persons are facing drug trafficking related charges under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. (File#2013-1553393)

-2013-12-20: Hay River RCMP executed a Search Warrant on a residence in Hay River under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. During the search a large quantity of drug related cash along with various prohibited weapons were located and seized. As a result, two people are facing charges under the Criminal Code and Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. (File#2013-1611507)

2013-12-09: Hay River RCMP Members attended to Diamond Jenness School and participated in a "challenge" sport with the High School classes.

2013-12-14: Hay River RCMP and family participated in the annual RCMP Toy Drive. Members spent the Saturday gathering toy, cash and food donations from community members for the purposes of distributing to families in need around the holidays.

2013-12-21: Hay River RCMP and family spent the day delivering toys to various families in the Hay River area. In total approximately 259 children were provided with toys and 100 grocery boxes including turkeys were distributed to families in need.



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
