
Prepare Your Property for Spring Breakup

Property owners should protect their property from flooding to reduce the likelihood of damages to their and neighbouring properties.



This includes reducing environmental contamination caused by fuel spills.

The Town of Hay River Zoning and Building Bylaw specifies building construction requirements for properties in defined flood zones. Other activities to consider include:

- Move equipment, vehicles and belongings stored outside;
- Elevate supplies and equipment stored in garages and sheds;
- Install barriers to protect low lying assets;
- Prepare and check sump and/or other pumps;
- Install / inspect backflow valves;
- Pump out sewer tanks ahead following any evacuation alerts;

- Install weather protection sealant around the base of lowlevel doors and windows;
- Do not store your important documents in the basement;
- Remove toxic substances such as pesticides and insecticides from the flood area to prevent pollution;
- Take special precautions to safeguard electrical or propane heating.

Prepare Your Household for an Evacuation

Evacuation is the key response activity coordinated by the Town of Hay River to protect residents through flood events.

Being prepared to evacuate with limited notice is important. Develop a plan for your family and practice it. Recognize that an evacuation may last for a week or longer between the end of April and mid May, and that access to your home, business, and community may not be possible.

If you or a household member will have special accommodation or travel needs during an evacuation, pre-register after the issue of an Evacuation Notice by calling 833-699-0188.

How to Prepare for an Evacuation

- Make a household emergency plan (www.getprepared.ca)
- · Prepare a basic emergency kit (checklist attached);
- Ensure to include prescriptions and medications for all family members;
- Make temporary accommodation arrangements where possible;
 - If you plan to use an RV / Camper / Cabin, prepare it for use. Remove surrounding snow, check tires, fill propane tanks, etc.
 - Basic accommodations are provided at the declared community evacuation centre
- Prepare supplies and plan for handling of pets;
- Have sufficient clothing and essentials for family members packed;
- Keep vehicles fueled.

Emergency Kit Checklist

Assemble one	Consider these additional
Water — two litres of water per person	emergency kit supplies
per day (include small bottles)	Two additional litres of water
Food that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dried facels (reaches a space succer)	per person per day for cooking and cleaning
foods (replace once a year)	Candles and matches or lighter (place in sturdy containers and do not)
Manual can opener	burn unattended)
Wind-up or battery-powered flashlight(and extra batteries)	Change of clothing and footwear for each household member
Wind-up or battery-powered radio (and extra batteries)	Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each household member
First aid kit	☐ Toiletries
Special needs items — pet food, prescription medications, infant	Hand sanitizer
formula or equipment for people with	Toilet paper
disabilities	Utensils
Extra keys for your car and house	Garbage bags
Cash — include smaller bills, such as \$10 bills	Household chlorine bleach or water purifying tablets
Emergency plan — include a copy in your kit as well as contact information	Basic tools (hammer, pliers, wrench, screwdrivers, work gloves, pocket knife)
or buy one	Small fuel-operated stove and fuel
You can buy an emergency kit online and in stores across Canada. St. John	Whistle (to attract attention)
Ambulance and The Salvation Army have	Duct tape

Animal Care During an Emergency

Arrange a safe haven for your pets in the event of evacuation.

Remember, if it isn't safe for you, it isn't safe for your pets. They may become trapped or escape and be exposed to numerous life-threatening hazards. *We encourage you to not leave your pets behind.*

Emergency Pet Kits

Keep a container of pet supplies handy. This kit should be clearly labeled and easy to carry. Items to consider keeping in or near your pack include:

- 3-7 days' worth of canned (pop-top) or dry food
- Disposable litter trays (aluminum roasting pans are perfect)
- Litter or paper toweling

- Disposable garbage bags for clean-up
- Pet food dishes and water bowls
- Extra harness and leash
- Blanket (for scooping up a fearful pet)

Flood Evacuation Messaging

The Town of Hay River has identified 3 distinct evacuation messages to alert residents, organizations, and visitors of evolving community flood risks. Different actions are initiated through each message type.

Evacuation Notice

- Issued through general Town of Hay River public communications
- Community wide notification
- Signals that breakup activity has begun in the Hay River area
- Indicates a general flood risk to the community
- Residents, organizations, and visitors should execute flood preparedness activity
- Those with special needs can preregister at 833-699-0188

Evacuation Alert

- Issued through general Town of Hay River public communications and the GNWT's NWT Alert System
- Typically issued for a defined area(s) of the community
- Indicates a heightened of risk of a potential flood event
- Residents, organizations, and visitors should closely monitor their environment and be prepared to evacuate on short or no-public notice
- Those with special needs can execute evacuation procedures

Evacuation Order

- Issued through general Town of Hay River public communications, GNWT's NWT Alert System, and Emergency Responders
- Residents, organizations, and visitors should execute evacuation procedures
- Register at Registration Centre, online, or by phone at 833-699-0188
- Travel to planned accommodation or Registration Centre. If assisted travel is required, contact Registration Centre at 833-699-0188
