SUBJECT: SS052-23 Fire – Recovery Plan and Current Status

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HAY RIVER accepts the SS052-23 Fire – Recovery Plan and Current Status report as information only.

BACKGROUND:

Following the emergency evacuation for fire SS052-23, PWS staff undertook asset assessments to the town's infrastructure. Although there were concerns with the proximity of the fire to a number of Town assets, inspections indicated that there were no major issues or loss of structures with the exception of NFTI. The following assets were inspected:

- Water Treatment Plant No damage to structure. Security fence was removed and requires replacement.
- **Sewage Lagoon** No damage, no further action required.
- Various Roadways and Easements Number of danger trees throughout town boundaries. Plans to remove trees which have been impacted is underway along Paradise Rd, Patterson Rd, Water Treatment Plant Road, and other locations as needed
- Water Conveyance Systems There are several water main, hydrant and valve leaks which teams are actioning now. This work will proceed until complete on a priority basis before colder temperatures.
- **Golf Course** Damage to a number of artificial green surfaces has been noted. Work with administration and Insurance is ongoing to determine financial impacts.
- **NFTI** The NFTI site was nearly completely destroyed by the fire. One small structure remains. Work with administration and Insurance is ongoing to determine financial impacts.

An impact to cost is unclear at this time, however, cost coverage for these items through MACA's Disaster Assistance Policy and insurance is being investigated.

Impacts to utilities have been limited to fire impacted areas. PWS is working with Northland Utilities on scheduling and identifying priority areas for service restoration. Contact has also been made with NWTEL, but indications are they are waiting for NUL to complete their work in advance of any NWTEL work.

Town Administration and the Mayor met with CN representatives about fire impact to the rail system. Over 10kms of rail and 54,000 rail ties are thought to need replacement through northern Alberta to Hay River. The worst of the damage is between Enterprise and Hay River. CN is beginning to mobilize crews and plans to restore as much of the system as possible before the winter.

SUBJECT: SS052-23 Fire – Recovery Plan and Current Status

In addition to repairs resulting from firefighting efforts, there have been significant impacts to timelines for routine maintenance and repairs around the municipality. Planned work for August is now being actioned, and no issues for completion of this work before colder temperatures is expected at this time.

Crews will be active around town over the coming weeks with a focus on the follow tasks:

- Water Main Repairs Gaetz Dr, Service Rd (Kal Tire), Stewart Dr
- Sewer Line Repairs Stewart Dr, John Mapes Cr
- Lagoon Desludging Contracted work with PWS team to support
- Street Light Removal
 Intersections of Gagnier/Woodland & River/Woodland
- Lighted Crosswalk Installation Three locations downtown

Other crews not involved in the active repairs and maintenance of the above noted infrastructure are actively servicing summer equipment in preparation for storage, and will begin servicing on winter equipment in preparation for the upcoming season per normal schedules.

Planning work is ongoing to complete some other temperature dependant work, but at this time it seems unlikely. If unsuccessful, the work will be deferred to 2024. That includes the following:

- · Asphalt crack sealing and road patching
- Sidewalk repairs
- Landscaping deficiencies in various locations

Impacts to the capital program are currently being assessed and will be reflected in the Q3 Capital Budget Update.

SUBJECT: Hay Shop Here Campaign

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HAY RIVER direct Administration to proceed with the Hay Shop Here Campaign as defined and fund from available grants for a \$15,000 budget.

BACKGROUND:

Local businesses have been negatively impacted by the recent fire. A plan to invigorate the local economy is intended to strengthen sustainability and support new businesses. The impact would be improved business recovery for existing businesses as well as an evident positive business environment that should attract new business. The plan would be a partnership between the Town of Hay River and the Hay River Chamber of Commerce. In addition to the below listed action items, the Small Business Week and Moonlight Madness usually sponsored by the Hay River Chamber of Commerce would be included as part of the campaign.

The long-term intention is to encourage the Hay River Chamber of Commerce to increase their activity and possibly bring this campaign wholly under their control at a point in the future.

The town Facebook page has seen over 4 million views in the last month and about 50,000 interactions. This activity is primarily related to the fire but can be leveraged for messaging for a short period of time.

The budget requested is \$15,000.

Action Plan

1) A logo and slogan have been created to be used for all messaging from Hay River about this campaign.

Slogan: Hay Shop Here

- 2) Businesses will be divided up by sector
- 3) A series of postings will be put up on the town Facebook page promoting businesses by sector. Businesses that relate to tourism will be posted on the Tourism Facebook page and then shared by the town.
- 4) 200 radio ads by sector will be released through to Christmas.
- 5) Further messaging will be tailored to relate to seasonality or other factors. This may include branded shopping bags, stickers and pins.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The budget of \$15,000 as a maximum would be to execute on all parts of the campaign. If the available funding was less, the shopping bags, stickers and pins would be removed as an option.

Funding for the plan will be from the Hay River Chamber of Commerce and if required additional funding from NWT ITI. Details and firm quotes are being finalized.

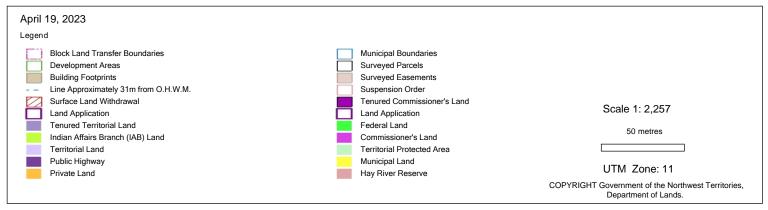




